KNOW YOUR *Child's Rights* AT SCHOOL HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH 2025



EQUAL EDUCATION FOR ALL

- Your child has the right to equal treatment at school, regardless of race, national origin, or immigration status.
- Schools cannot deny children a free public education, even if they are undocumented.
- Students with limited English must be given language instruction and support.
- Schools must protect students from harassment and bullying.

PRIVACY AND PROTECTION

- Schools must protect the privacy of your family.
- Schools cannot ask for your immigration status to enroll your child.
- Students cannot be forced to give up their personal information without consent.

FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION

- Students have the right to express their views, wear clothing with messages, or hand out flyers, as long as it does not disrupt the school.
- Schools cannot punish students just because they disagree with their message.
- Outside of school, students have the full right to free speech, including on social media.

INTERACTIONS WITH POLICE AT SCHOOL



- **Be aware:** ICE and police may **racially profile** Hispanic students based on appearance, language, or accent. This can affect **any student** regardless of their **status**.
- ICE needs a judicial warrant (not just an administrative one) to enter private property.
- Tell your child not to argue, resist, run, or interfere with the officer.
- They can ask if they are free to leave. If the answer is yes, they should calmly and quietly walk away.
- Your child has the right to remain silent if questioned by police.
- They do not have to consent to a search of their belongings.
 Police need a warrant.
- If taken into custody, your child has the right to a lawyer.
- Immigration status does not change these rights.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

- Students with disabilities have the right to equal access to classes, activities, technology, and health services.
- Schools must provide accommodations and protect them from harassment or bullying.

TLGBQIA+ STUDENT RIGHTS

- Schools must ensure a safe learning environment for TLGBQIA+ students.
- Harassment based on appearance, gender identity, or expression must not be ignored.
- Students cannot be forced to wear clothing that conflicts with their gender identity.
