Dear Parthiv Patel:

Enclosed are an *Application for Admission to the Bar of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Application)*, with instructions; and your *Certificate Recommending Admission to the Bar of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (Certificate)*. The completed *Application*, your *Certificate*, and the appropriate filing fee **must be filed within six months of the date of this letter** with the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania for you to be admitted to the bar.

If you do not file the required materials for admission to the bar within six months, your *Certificate* will lapse. In that case, you will be required to complete and file with the Board of Law Examiners a *Supplemental Application for Character and Fitness Determination* with the applicable filing fee. The supplemental application process requires a new character and fitness determination and may take up to three months or longer to complete.

Until the date of your admission to the bar of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, you have an ongoing obligation to keep current and update the responses provided in your application for character and fitness determination with the Board of Law Examiners.

Bar examination results are valid for three years. If you do not become admitted to the bar within three years of the date of this letter, your results will expire. You will then be required to reapply and meet all of the requirements for admission to the bar, including taking a future bar examination.
